### *The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997* [section 35.1]

#### ORDER FOR INCREASING WEIGHT DESIGNATION ON PROVINCIAL HIGHWAYS

**Reference:** Increasing weight limits on sections of Provincial Highway Nos. 3, 4, 13, 15, 21, 26, 32, 33, 35, 55, 120, 334, 335, and 368 with reference to the Provincial Highway Primary Weight Review and New Policy Framework final report.

For the purpose of managing traffic on and protecting provincial highways, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that effective 12:00 Midnight, June 30, 2006 unless restricted by a Minister's Order issued under section 35 of *The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997*, this Order authorizes any person, vehicle or class of vehicles to operate at the weights set for primary highways by *The Vehicle Weight and Dimension Regulations, 1999*, on provincial highways listed in the attached "Schedule A" to this Order, with the exception of April, May and June of each year.

This Order will remain in effect until March 31, 2010 unless sooner varied or rescinded.

#### SCHEDULE A — TO INCREASE WEIGHT DESIGNATION ON PROVINCIAL HIGHWAYS

- Provincial Highway No. 3 from its junction with Provincial Highway No. 12 at Shell Lake to its junction with Provincial Highway No. 4 at Glaslyn.
- Provincial Highway No. 3 from its junction with Provincial Highway No. 26, 29.2 km north of Turtleford to its junction with Provincial Highway No. 17.
- Provincial Highway No. 4 from its junction with Provincial Highway No. 13 at Cadillac to Swift Current.
- Provincial Highway No. 13 from Weyburn to its junction with Provincial Highway No. 6.

 INDUSTRY MANAGEMENT ORDER, 2006

**Order No. 41/06.** The Saskatchewan Egg Producers, pursuant to provisions of *The Agri-Food Act, 2004* and *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations* hereby determines and orders that:

This Order No. 41/06 – an order regarding the granting of licences to produce and market eggs and the management of production limits, shall be referred to as *The Industry Management Order, 2006*.

INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Order:

- (a) **“Act”** means *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*;
- (b) **“base production limit”** means the maximum number of hens that a licensed producer may possess to produce the number of dozens of eggs per year as set out in the licensed producer’s licence;
- (c) **“Board”** means the Saskatchewan Egg Producers;
- (d) **“CEMA”** means the Canadian Egg Marketing Agency;
- (e) **“eggs”** means any class of eggs or egg products produced from eggs laid by a hen, but does not include **“broiler hatching eggs”** as defined in *The Broiler Hatching Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*;
- (f) **“hen”** means a female common domestic fowl of the species *Gallus domesticus* that is producing eggs;
- (g) **“licence”** means a valid licence issued pursuant to Part V of the Regulations;
- (h) **“licensed producer”** means a producer to whom a licence has been issued and whose licence is in good standing;
- (i) **“possess”** includes, without limitation, possession by ownership, lease or any other means;
- (j) **“producer”** means a person who is engaged in the production, and marketing of eggs in Saskatchewan;
- (k) **“production facilities”** means the buildings, improvements, equipment and other facilities where eggs are produced and the land on which those buildings, improvements, equipment and facilities are located;

(l) “**production limit**” means the number of dozens of eggs that a licensed producer is authorized to produce per year in accordance with Part VII of the Regulations and that is set out in the licensed producer’s licence;

(m) “**production location**” means the location where a licensed producer produces eggs as set out in the producer’s licence or as identified by the producer and recorded by the Board; and

(n) “**Regulations**” means *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*.

**1.2** In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Order and the provisions of the Regulations or the Act, the provisions of the Regulations or the Act, as the case may be, shall govern to the extent of such conflict.

#### RULES RESPECTING THE LICENSING AND USE OF PRODUCTION LIMITS

**2.1** No person, other than an exempt producer referred to in subsection 6(1) of *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*, shall produce or market eggs unless the person is a licensed producer.

**2.2** A person may apply to the Board to be issued a licence to produce and market eggs.

**2.3** A producer shall obtain a separate licence for each production location that is owned or operated by that producer.

**2.4** No licensed producer shall possess a number of hens at a production location in excess of the base production limit set out in that producer’s licence for that production location.

**2.5** The production limit allotted to a licensed producer may only be produced at the production location specified in the licence granting that production limit. A licensed producer may not transfer all or any part of that producer’s production limit to another location without the prior written approval of the Board.

**2.6** Production limits are the property of the Board.

**2.7** If the licence of a licensed producer expires, or is cancelled or not renewed by the Board, the production limit allotted by that licence reverts to the Board.

**2.8** If the Board cancels or reduces a production limit pursuant to section 54 of the *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*, that production limit, or the reduction of the production limit, as the case may be, reverts to the Board.

**2.9** If a production limit reverts to the Board for any reason, the Board shall offer that production limit for sale by auction in accordance with section 51 of *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*.

**2.10** If the total provincial allotment of production limits is increased or decreased by CEMA, the Board shall implement that increase or decrease in accordance with sections 50, 51, and 52 of *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*.

**2.11** A licensed producer or licensed producers may be allowed by the Board to place 101% of its or their base production limit at the time of each such placement, without penalty, to allow a reasonable hen mortality allowance if, and only if, all of the following conditions are satisfied:

(a) the Board receives a properly completed application in writing from the licensed producer or licensed producers at least 10 business days prior to the date of each requested placement, or in such shorter or other period of time as the Board may in its discretion allow, using the approved form entitled Mortality Allowance Form;

(b) the licensed producer or licensed producers place at one time the entire allocation of hens assigned to the production location or contiguous production locations, owned by the licensed producer or owned jointly or severally by the licensed producers, specified in the Mortality Allowance Form;

(c) there are no other contiguous production locations on which the licensed producer or licensed producers place hens;

(d) all placement permits relating to the licensed producer or licensed producers at that production location or contiguous production locations bear an identical date of placement; and

(e) the licensed producer or licensed producers receive the prior written approval of the Board for each requested placement.

**2.12** For the purpose of determining a licensed producer’s base production limit, the productive capacity per hen shall be the “Cost of Production – Rate of Lay” specified by CEMA from time to time.

**2.13** If the “Cost of Production – Rate of Lay” prescribed by CEMA from time to time is increased by CEMA, any resulting decrease in a licensed producer’s production limit shall be implemented at the time of that producer’s next flock change.

**2.14** When a licensed producer disposes all or any part of that producer’s allocation of hens from a production location, that producer shall provide to the Board a properly completed form prescribed by the Board entitled Flock Disposal Verification Form within seven days of the date of disposal.

**2.15** The licensed producer (or the major shareholder or principal partner in the case of a licensed producer that is a corporation or partnership) shall be personally engaged in the management and daily operation of that producer’s production facilities.

#### ELIGIBILITY AND CONDITIONS OF LICENCES

**3.1** The Board shall have the power to establish different categories of licences to be issued to different categories of producers.

**3.2** A licence issued by the Board is a licence to be engaged in the activity stated in the licence.

**3.3** The Board shall by order establish the terms and conditions applicable to each category of licence.

**3.4** A licence issued by the Board shall be valid for the calendar year for which it was issued, commencing on the effective date specified in the licence and expiring on the following 31<sup>st</sup> day of December.

**3.5** A licence holder who is an individual must be at least 18 years of age.

**3.6** In the case of a licence holder that is a corporation, partnership or other unincorporated body of persons:

(a) each director of such licence holder must be at least 18 years of age;

(b) each individual who has a beneficial or legal interest in such licence holder, must be at least 18 years of age.

**3.7** A licensed producer shall comply with any terms and conditions imposed on that producer’s licence pursuant to sections 3.3 and 3.8 of this Order.

**3.8** If the Board issues a licence to an applicant, the Board shall state in the licence:

(a) the name and address of the licensee;

(b) the licence number;

(c) the type of activity that the licensee may engage in;

(d) the production limit allotted pursuant to Part VII of the Regulations to the licensed producer;

(e) the base production limit assigned to the producer at that production location, or the maximum number of hens the licensed producer may possess at any one time at that production location; and

(f) the production location for which the licence is issued and to which the production limit is assigned.

**3.9** A producer is eligible to be licensed and to enjoy the rights and responsibilities of licensed producers as set out in Division 2 of Part III of *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations* if, and only if, the producer holds a minimum of 300 hens under the producer's management and in production at that person's or entity's production location.

#### APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE TO PRODUCE AND MARKET EGGS

**4.1** An application for a new licence by an individual must be submitted using the form prescribed by the Board entitled "Licence Application (Individuals)", which application must contain the following information and include the following documentation:

(a) the name, place of residence and mailing address of the applicant;

(b) the age of the applicant, together with a photocopy of the applicant's birth certificate or other proof of age acceptable to the Board;

(c) the legal description of the production location for which the licence is to be issued; and

(d) such other information and documentation as the Board may require.

**4.2** An application for a new licence by a corporation, partnership or other unincorporated body of persons must be submitted using the form prescribed by the Board entitled "Licence Application (Non-Individuals)", which application must contain the following information and include the following documentation:

(a) the name, place of business and mailing address of the applicant;

(b) a photocopy of the applicant's certificate of incorporation or other charter documents;

(c) the name, place of residence and mailing address of each director of the applicant, if applicable;

(d) the age of each director of the applicant, together with a photocopy of each such director's birth certificate or other proof of age acceptable to the Board;

(e) the name, place of residence and mailing address of each shareholder, partner or other person having a beneficial or legal ownership interest in the applicant;

(f) the age of each individual who has a beneficial or legal ownership interest in the applicant, together with a photocopy of each such person's birth certificate or other proof of age acceptable to the Board;

(g) the legal description of the production location for which the licence is to be issued; and

(h) such other information and documentation as the Board may require.

**4.3** A Licence Application must be accompanied by one or more of the following:

(a) an offer to purchase a production limit from the Board submitted by the applicant in response to a production limit auction being conducted by the Board;

(b) an application to transfer production limit to the applicant, submitted in accordance with Article 5 of this Order; or

(c) an application to lease production limit to the applicant, submitted in accordance with Article 6 of this Order.

**4.4** Every Licence Application must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$50.00, payable to the Saskatchewan Egg Producers.

**4.5** The Board may refuse to issue a licence pursuant to subsection 30(1) of the Regulations. If the Board refuses to issue a licence to an applicant, the Board shall advise the applicant in writing of the reasons for its decision.

#### TRANSFERS OF PRODUCTION LIMITS

**5.1** No licensed producer or other person holding a production limit shall transfer all or any part of that person's production limit to another person, with or without the applicable production location, without the prior written approval of the Board. Any transfer of production limit other than in accordance with the Regulations and this Order is void.

**5.2** A licensed producer or other person holding a production limit wishing to transfer all or any part of that person's production limit, with or without the applicable production location, shall first apply to the Board for approval using the form prescribed by the Board entitled "Production Limit Transfer Application".

**5.3** An application to transfer all or any part of a person's production limit must include the following information and documentation:

(a) the name and licence number, if applicable, of the person applying for the transfer;

(b) the amount of production limit (in numbers of dozens of eggs) to be transferred;

(c) the production location from which the production limit is to be transferred;

(d) the name of the proposed transferee and whether that transferee is an existing licensed producer;

(e) if the proposed transferee is not an existing licensed producer, a Licence Application from that transferee in accordance with section 4.1 or 4.2 of this Order;

(f) if the proposed transferee is an existing licensed producer, a Licence Amendment Application from such transferee;

(g) the production location where the transferred production limit is to be operated;

(h) the date that the proposed transfer of the production limit is to be effective; and

(i) such other information and documentation as the Board may require.

**5.4** A Production Limit Transfer Application must be submitted not less than 30 days before the proposed transfer is to become effective, or within such shorter period of time as the Board may permit.

**5.5** A Production Limit Transfer Application must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$50.00 payable to the Saskatchewan Egg Producers.

**5.6** The transferee of a production limit must be a licensed producer whose licence is in good standing or who qualifies for a licence to operate as a licensed producer pursuant to the Regulations and this Order.

**5.7** A transfer of a production limit approved by the Board shall be subject to section 52 of the Regulations.

**5.8** The Board may refuse to approve a transfer of a production limit. If the Board refuses to approve a transfer of a production limit, the Board shall promptly advise the applicant in writing of the reasons for its decision.

### PRODUCTION LIMIT LEASES

**6.1** No licensed producer or other person or entity to which a production limit has been allotted or assigned shall lease all or any part of that person's or entity's production limit to another person or entity, without the prior written approval of the Board. Any lease of a production limit other than in accordance with the Regulations and this Order is void.

**6.2** A production limit allotted or assigned to a person, corporation or entity shall remain allotted or assigned to that person, corporation or entity notwithstanding a lease agreement, approved by the Board in accordance with this Order, which leases out the authorization to produce and market eggs specified by that production limit.

**6.3** A licensed producer or other entity to which a production limit has been allotted or assigned wishing to lease all or any part of that person's or entity's production limit, shall first apply to the Board for approval using the form prescribed by the Board entitled: Production Limit Lease Application.

**6.4** An application to lease all or any part of a person's or entity's production limit must include the following information and documentation:

- (a) the name of the person or entity applying to lease a production limit;
- (b) the amount of production limit to be leased;
- (c) the production location from which the production limit is to be leased;
- (d) the name of the proposed lessee and whether that proposed lessee is an existing licensed producer;
- (e) if the proposed lessee is not an existing licensed producer, a Licence Application from that transferee in accordance with section 4.1 or 4.2 of this Order;
- (f) if the proposed lessee is an existing licensed producer, a Licence Amendment Application from such lessee;
- (g) the production location where the leased production limit is to be operated;
- (h) the duration of the lease, including the date the lease is to commence and the date the lease is to expire;
- (i) a written copy of the lease intended to be put into place; and
- (j) such other information and documentation as the Board may require.

**6.5** A Production Limit Lease Application must be submitted not less than 30 days before the proposed lease is to become effective or within such shorter period of time as the Board may permit.

**6.6** A Production Limit Lease Application must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$20.00 payable to the Saskatchewan Egg Producers.

**6.7** A lessee of a production limit must be a licensed producer whose license is in good standing or who qualifies for a licence to operate as a licensed producer pursuant to the Regulations and this Order.

**6.8** A lease of a production limit approved by the Board shall be subject to section 53 of the Regulations.

**6.9** The Board may refuse to approve a lease of a production limit. If the Board refuses to approve a lease of a production limit, the Board shall promptly advise the applicant in writing of the reasons for its decision.

**6.10** Once an allocation of hens has been placed in the lessee's production facilities pursuant to a lease of a production limit approved by the Board, the lessee shall be responsible for ensuring that the leased production limit is operated and produced in compliance with the Act, Regulations, this Order and all other lawful orders and directions issued by the Board or the Agri-Food Council. The lessee shall be liable for all levies assessed by the Board in respect of the leased production limit.

### LICENCE AMENDMENTS

**7.1** A licensed producer shall apply to the Board for an amendment to the terms of that producer's licence where:

- (a) the name or address of that producer has changed;
- (b) in the case of a corporation, partnership or other unincorporated body of persons, there has been a change in the directors or beneficial or legal owners of that producer or a change of address of such directors or beneficial or legal owners;
- (c) that producer intends to relocate all or part of that producer's allocation of hens from the production location specified in that producer's licence to another location; or
- (d) that producer intends to lease out all or a part of its production limit or intends to lease in an additional production limit.
- (e) that producer intends to transfer out part of its production limit or intends to transfer in an addition to its production limit.

**7.2** A licensed producer wishing to apply for an amendment to the terms of that producer's licence shall apply to the Board using the form prescribed by the Board entitled "Licence Amendment Application".

**7.3** An Application to Amend a Licence must contain such information and must include such supporting documentation as the Board may prescribe.

**7.4** A Licence Amendment Application in respect of the matters referred to in clauses 7.1(a) and (b) of this Order must be submitted no later than 10 days after the change has occurred. A Licence Amendment Application in respect of the matters referred to in clauses 7.1(c) and (d) of this Order must be submitted to the Board not less than 30 days before the proposed change is to become effective, or within such shorter period as the Board may permit.

**7.5** A Licence Amendment Application must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$20.00 payable to the Saskatchewan Egg Producers.

**7.6** The Board may refuse to consent to a proposed change of a production location.

### RENEWAL, CANCELLATION AND SUSPENSION OF A LICENCE

**8.1** A licensed producer wishing to renew its licence for the next calendar year must submit an application using the form prescribed by the Board entitled "Licence Renewal Application", on or before November 15<sup>th</sup> or such other date as the Board may determine.

**8.2** A Licence Renewal Application for an existing licensed producer must contain the following information:

- (a) the name and mailing address of that producer;
- (b) confirmation that there has been no change in the information previously provided to the Board regarding the licensed producer; and
- (c) confirmation that the licensed producer is in good standing and not in default of any provision of the Act, Regulations, this Order or any other lawful order or direction issued by the Board or the Agri-Food Council.



**8.3** Every Licence Renewal Application must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$20.00, payable to the Saskatchewan Egg Producers.

**8.4** The Board may refuse to renew a licensed producer's licence or cancel or suspend a licence pursuant to subsection 30(2) of the Regulations.

**8.5** The Board may:

- (a) suspend a licence for a period that it considers appropriate; or
- (b) in the case of a licence that is suspended, remove the suspension.

**8.6** A decision by the Board to refuse to renew a licence or cancel or suspend a licence shall be communicated in writing to the affected licensed producer promptly after the decision of the Board has been made and shall include the reasons for the Board's decision.

#### CANCELLATION, SUSPENSION AND REDUCTION OF PRODUCTION LIMITS

**9.1** The Board may suspend, cancel or reduce all or part of the production limit held by a licensed producer or other person pursuant to subsection 54(1) of the Regulations.

**9.2** A decision by the Board to cancel, suspend or reduce a person's production limit shall be communicated in writing to that person promptly after the decision of the Board has been made and shall include the reasons for the Board's decision.

#### EGG STATIONS

**10.1** No person shall grade and market eggs unless the person is licensed as an egg station.

**10.2** A person may apply to the Board to be issued an egg station licence to grade and market eggs.

**10.3** An application for an egg station licence must be submitted using the form prescribed by the Board entitled "Egg Station Licence Application", and must contain the information and include the documentation required by the Board.

**10.4** An egg station licence issued by the Board shall be valid for the calendar year for which it was issued, commencing on the effective date specified in the licence and expiring on the following 31st day of December.

**10.5** Every application for an egg station licence must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$20.00, payable to the Saskatchewan Egg Producers.

#### COMPLIANCE

**11.1** The license of a licensed producer shall not be in good standing if:

- (a) the licensed producer contravenes or otherwise fails to comply with the Act, the Regulations, this Order or any other lawful order or direction issued by the Board or the Agri-Food Council; or
- (b) the licensed producer owes an amount or debt to the Board for a period of ninety days or more;

and the license shall not be in good standing for as long as the contravention continues or for as long as the amount due or debt to the Board remains outstanding.

**11.2** Subject to section 11.4, a producer whose license is not in good standing:

- (a) shall not be eligible to participate in a sale of production limits conducted pursuant to section 51 of the Regulations;

(b) shall not be eligible to transfer or lease all or any part of that producer's production limit;

(c) shall not be eligible to acquire by transfer or lease any additional production limit from another person;

(d) shall not be eligible to vote at meetings of licensed producers;

(e) shall not be eligible to attend a closed meeting of licensed producers;

(f) shall not be eligible to vote to elect Directors in accordance with Part IV of *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*; and

(g) shall not be eligible to serve as a Director of the Board.

**11.3** A licensed producer whose license is not in good standing shall be liable to a penalty as determined by the Board of an amount between \$0.00/week and \$5.00/week for each hen in that producer's base production limit, for as long as that producer's licence is not in good standing.

**11.4** Notwithstanding section 11.2, the Board may by motion, on an individual case by case basis and in its absolute discretion, permit a producer whose license is not in good standing to do any of the things listed in clauses 11.2(d) and (e).

**11.5** Subject to section 11.6, a producer who is not licensed:

(a) shall not be eligible to vote at meetings of licensed producers;

(b) shall not be eligible to attend a closed meeting of licensed producers;

(c) shall not be eligible to vote to elect Directors in accordance with Part IV of *The Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations*; and

(d) shall not be eligible to serve as a Director of the Board.

**11.6** Notwithstanding section 11.5, the Board may by motion, on an individual case by case basis and in its absolute discretion, permit a producer who is not licensed to do any of the things listed in clauses 11.5(a) and (b).

**11.7** Without limiting the generality of section 11.2 of this Order, a licensed producer who contravenes section 2.4 or 2.11 of this Order shall pay to the Board a penalty of \$2.00 per hen per week, on the excess number of hens in that producer's possession for as long as the contravention continues.

**11.8** No one shall possess at one or more locations more than 299 hens in aggregate, unless the person or entity is a licensed producer.

**11.9** No persons or entities in a relationship that is not at arms length may possess more than 299 hens in aggregate at one or more locations unless all persons or entities are licensed producers.

**11.10** Any one who contravenes section 11.8 or 11.9 of this Order shall pay to the Board a penalty of \$2.00 per hen on the excess number of hens in the possession of that person or entity, and a further \$2.00 per hen on the excess number of hens in the possession of that person or entity for each week that the contravention continues.

**11.11** Any one who has contravened section 2.4, 2.11, 11.8 or 11.9 of this Order, as the case may be, shall be deemed to remain in contravention of such section until such time as the Board has received a properly completed Flock Disposal Verification Form which certifies that the person or entity is in compliance with the said section.

## GENERAL MATTERS

**12.1** The Board shall maintain one or more registers identifying each category of licence, containing the name, address and licence number of each person to whom the Board has issued a licence, together with such other information as the Board considers appropriate. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Board shall maintain:

- (a) a register of all producers licensed to produce and market eggs;
- (b) a register of all producers licensed to produce and market eggs for the processing market;
- (c) a register of all persons who hold a production limit including all those who have leased out their entire production limit, and all those who have leased out their entire production limit other than 299 hens or less; and
- (d) a register of all persons licensed to grade and market eggs.

**12.2** Any notice given pursuant to this Order to a licensed producer or an applicant for a licence shall be delivered to the licensed producer or the applicant, as the case may be, at the address set out in such licensed producer's licence or such applicant's application for a licence.

**12.3** Any application or form referred to in this Order may be obtained via regular mail or facsimile by contacting the Board or by visiting the Board's website at [www.saskegg.ca](http://www.saskegg.ca).

**12.4** Subject to subsection 9(2) of the Act, before:

- (a) refusing to grant a new licence to an applicant pursuant to section 4.5 of this Order;
- (b) refusing to approve a transfer of a production limit pursuant to section 5.8 of this Order;
- (c) refusing to approve a lease of a production limit pursuant to section 6.8 of this Order;
- (d) refusing to renew the licence or cancelling or suspending the licence of a licensed producer pursuant to section 8.4 of this Order;
- (e) cancelling, suspending or reducing a person's production limit pursuant to section 9.1 of this Order;

the Board shall first provide the person to be affected by any such decision of the Board with written notice (the "Notice") of its intention to do so and the reasons for considering such action. The Notice shall also set out the date, time and place of the meeting of the Board at which the Board intends to consider such action. The Notice shall be given to the affected person at least 15 days before the meeting of the Board at which the Board intends to consider the matter in question.

**12.5** The Board shall afford any person receiving a Notice pursuant to section 12.4 of this Order the opportunity to appear before the Board at the meeting referred to in the Notice in order to address the matters raised in the Notice. The person receiving such Notice may also make a written submission to the Board responding to the matters set out in the Notice, provided such written submission has been delivered to the Board prior to the commencement of the meeting referred to in the Notice.

## TRANSITION RULES

**13.1** Any licensed producer that held a valid licence issued by the Board at the time this Order came into effect shall be deemed to continue to hold a valid licence under this Order. Any quota held by a person by way of a valid quota certificate or a valid production permit or an approved lease at the time this Order came into effect, shall be deemed to be an equal amount of production limit under this Order. All such licences and production limits shall expire effective December 31, 2005.

**13.2** All licensed producers and all persons holding production limits referred to in section 13.1 of this Order, shall be subject to and comply with all of the requirements under this Order from and after its effective date.

**13.3** Order No. 39/05 is hereby revoked.
